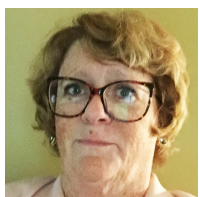
Mark Rosenberg (BA, MSc, PhD)

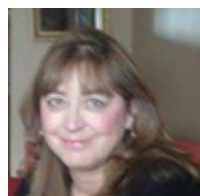
John Gerretsen (BA, LL.B, QC)
